

MHS student members of MoMs youth group recognized by Bergen County United Way Housing

On Wednesday, Nov. 18, the students of Memorial High School's youth program My Outreach Mission (MoMs) were recognized by the Bergen County United Way Housing for their volunteer efforts in helping the homeless.

Last May, the members of MoMs helped 22 homeless people – some who had been displaced by a residential fire – move into permanent homes. Recognizing the group for their efforts was Director of Development Cheryl Moses, who also presented Principal Robert Sanchez with a 'Live United Housing Works' key in thanks to the MoMs members and the Memorial High School community. The key is symbolic of the homeless now having a home, and MoMs attempt at ending homelessness.

MoMs, which has over 200 members at Memorial High School, performs volunteer work throughout the year, and will be helping out at the Bowery Mission Transitional Center in New York City this coming Thanksgiving.
