*Project Triple Threat*

The West New York School District will be launching one of its first small learning communities at Memorial High School for the 2008-2009 school year. *Project Triple Threat* will be a small learning community of students with a focus on the performing arts.

As an introduction to the first time program, students will be attending a week long summer workshop from Aug. 25 to 29. The students will be working in groups of 12 from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. with professional acting, dancing and vocal instructors.

Project Triple Threat is a theater arts program training the actors of tomorrow to do it all sing, dance, and act. This first year a total of 25 students will be involved in the program, which will include three periods of theater arts instruction and lunch. The remaining class periods will be devoted to regular core curriculum academics including history, science, math or English.

During the theater arts portion students will receive vocal training, as well as dance training twice a week and acting training twice a week. They will also have one day of career consultation, where they will learn about the different colleges for the performing arts and the audition process.

These students will also be showcasing their talents in several productions and workshops throughout the year.
